Sermon Title: No One Man Should Have All That Power Scripture: John 6: 1-15

Some time after this, Jesus crossed to the far shore of the Sea of Galilee (that is, the Sea of Tiberias), and a great crowd of people followed him because they saw the signs he had performed by healing the sick. Then Jesus went up on a mountainside and sat down with his disciples. The Jewish Passover Festival was near. When Jesus looked up and saw a great crowd coming toward him, he said to Philip, "Where shall we buy bread for these people to eat?" He asked this only to test him, for he already had in mind what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "It would take more than half a year's wages to buy enough bread for each one to have a bite!"

Another of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, spoke up, "Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people sit down." There was plenty of grass in that place, and they sat down (about five thousand men were there). Jesus then took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted. He did the same with the fish. When they had all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, "Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted." So they gathered them and filled twelve baskets with the pieces of the five barley loaves left over by those who had eaten.

After the people saw the sign Jesus performed, they began to say, "Surely this is the Prophet who is to come into the world." Jesus, knowing that they intended to come and make him king by force, withdrew again to a mountain by himself.

However, we did our best to teach our students online via WhatsApp. We also send them packages with homework and lesson plans weekly. We started



in-person classes on January 9th where 38 children came to class from our 67 registered for the school year. We had to stop in-person classes after two weeks due to rivalry militias' fight. The children are eager to come to school but each day they come to class could be their last one. However, we are doing our best to train and empower our future generation for Christ.



God continues to answer our prayers. The construction is near to completion. We are done with electricity, welding, and ceramic. Our next project will be painting, finish plumbing, and the outside walling. We are making great progress and are thankful for everyone's support. The building will serve as office for the ministry as well as housing for Megeste for a year. The construction is a great blessing to the ministry. We could not do it without your support.

While serving in Haiti is not the easiest thing but we are doing our best to share the love of God in words and in deeds. The challenges are many to count but we would not be able to make it this far without your prayers and support. Therefore, we want you to know that we are thankful for your continuing partnership.
