## Open Secrets – by Brady Horner

In the late '90s/early 2000s—before streaming, social media, and online gaming—professional wrestling was at peak popularity. Goldberg, Hollywood Hogan, and Stone Cold were exciting characters that did some outrageous things. I hate to tell you this, but it was all fake (and so are "reality" TV shows for that matter)! They are just actors, and everything was scripted. Okay, I know you know that, everyone knows that, it's an open secret! Open secrets are a weird phenomenon. Like the "elephant in the room" it's when there is something that everyone knows, but no one wants to acknowledge. Acknowledging an open secret might ruin the fun, might expose someone, or demand a group take action that no one wants to take. Some open secrets I think of are a gay family member, a company's illegal activity, marital strife or even affairs, or the immorality of a beloved leader or hero.

This is kind of a buzzkill, but good leaders address the "elephant in the room"; they talk about the open secret. In 1 Corinthians 5 we see the church's open secret that a man (likely a powerful one) is having an incestuous relationship. Everyone turns their head and ignores it, because it's awkward, no one wants to deal with it, and holding a powerful man accountable might have repercussions. In a bold move of leadership, Paul calls it out and brings it to the forefront. Similarly, Jesus exposed the open secret amongst the Pharisees that they are more into themselves than God; he points out how their practices confirm that. As awkward as exposing the open secret can be, it is often real and refreshing and can lead to transformation of a community.

Are there open secrets in your family, at your work, in our church, or in our society? What would pointing to them do? Perhaps it will create conflict (this is a legitimate fear) so it takes strong leadership to navigate it. Pointing to the "elephant" will also require people to change...which no one likes. But change is growth and can be the beginning of transformation. This creates an open environment that is honest about ourselves and who we are, which is so refreshing. It leads to a genuine community where people can feel safe to share themselves and find real support and healing. Let's be willing to address the open secrets and be supportive of leaders who do the same.
