The Voice Paradox – by Brady Horner

Have you ever listened to a recording of your own voice and cringed? You aren't alone! This is a normal phenomenon called voice confrontation. Evidently, we perceive the sound of our own voices differently than others do. When we hear our own voice, we hear sound waves that travel through the air, but also through our own body (the sinuses and cranial cavity), so we perceive our voices as being fuller and lower. So, we are shocked or even disappointed when we hear our high and lacking voice on a recording. But there is more to it than that...

Interestingly there have been studies where people hear different voices and rate the attractiveness of what they hear. Unbeknownst to the study participants, their own voice is inserted into the wealth of other voices they listen to. Most participants rated their own voice as attractive! So, when we know it's our voice, we don't like it, but when we hear it anonymously it's not bad at all! Why is that? It could be that we are simply harder on ourselves than others, or more self-conscious. These studies suggest that we really don't like our voice (when we know it's ours) because it shows us that we have evaluated or perceived ourselves inaccurately. This makes us feel exposed and makes us worry about what else we have "got wrong" about ourselves. It's scary knowing that we can't accurately curate our image.

We all need this dose of reality sometimes. We need to be shown a mirror and see ourselves objectively. We need to realize we may be wrong about ourselves, perhaps we have given ourselves an overly flattering evaluation. We need to see our inconsistencies where our stated values don't add up with our lifestyle. We need humility to see that we have room for improvement. Or better, the humility to see that our personal image or "brand" isn't everything. Where can you go to see a mirror of yourself, to see who you really are? Friends and loved ones can provide feedback (sometimes whether you ask for it or not). It could be a healthy, and admittedly difficult task, to have them gently guide you in areas you need to work on. James 1 compares God's Word to a mirror. It shows us who we really are, who we are called to be, and sometimes even what we are missing. Looking in the mirror can be a painful process, but it leads to healing and transformation.
