From the Internet to the Real World pt. 2 – by Brady Horner

This article series has been exploring the way phone and online behavior is spilling over into our real-world interactions. If you follow happenings in the sports world, you might notice an uptick in negative interactions between athletes and opposing fans: yelling, cursing, bigoted slurs, and even physical altercations. At first, I thought this has always been happening (I haven't forgotten about the "Malice at the Palace"). I supposed, the media is just making a big deal of it now as we are giving athletes more of a voice and shining a light on equality issues. Now I'm convinced it actually is worse, fans are becoming real world "internet trolls". It is learned behavior.

An internet troll is a person who posts comments aimed at hurting and upsetting others behind the safety of a screen. They feel power from getting an emotional response out of people and are completely safe from any repercussions since they are distant and anonymous. Sports trolls have the same luxury. These trolls can yell anything they want at athletes knowing that if the athlete responds he or she will be penalized. I'm not asking you to feel sorry for these rich "entitled" athletes. But we should be disgusted by the behavior of these equally entitled fans (who are likely to also be "rich" if they have seats close enough to be heard by the athletes).

Behind trolling is a sense of entitlement, and a sick sense of power from manipulating the emotions of others. It's an abuse of power; a troll thinks because I can safely hurt, I should. A troll exercises power, without feeling the responsibility and consequences that come with it. Like last week's article discussed, a troll can view people as less than human, just symbols on a screen. There are plenty of examples of real-world trolling: the vindictive student who knows parents will rescue them from a teacher's discipline, the angry patron ranting at a fast-food worker, the bigot yelling racial slurs at a pedestrian as they drive by. Christ had power but chose not to exploit it; rather than using it for his own advantage, he gave it up or used it for others. How do you use your power? How do you treat those that you have power over? May we be shaped by Christ not culture.
