## **Uber Car Confessions – by Brady Horner**

Uber, Lyft, and other rideshare companies have pretty much become the main way to get around any major city while traveling. Typically, whenever we travel, I end up riding shotgun and visiting with the driver. This is a cool way to get to know locals and grasp the culture of an area. I've met a lot of interesting people and learned some cool things from Uber rides. This article series will share some of these experiences and insights.

In Cairns, Australia, my family rode with a guy who was cool but kept blurting out all these stereotypes that Aussies have of us. They definitely think we are all dumb! He told us a story about an American being shocked that there are white people in Australia! If you didn't know that we need to talk. He also just assumed we hate all people of color. Not to say there isn't racism here, but you can tell the media has had its impact. Most interestingly, he noted that we Americans are weird about rules and laws. He pointed this out when we didn't wear seat belts in the back seat. He might be right about that one, because I thought Aussies were a bunch of rule followers! They drive the speed limit exactly (just a kilometer or two over gets you a ticket) and there is video surveillance everywhere. They were strictly locked down during Covid with little pushback. Another Uber driver I spoke with said Sydney lost its soul when they gave in to strict laws that prevented violent crime. They do not question if a rule should be in place; if it's a rule, just or unjust, they obey it.

Generally, Americans are quick to question rules. If they think they are dumb, they might disregard them. This likely comes from our distrust of authority and unshakable commitment to freedom. It's annoying when people think rules don't apply to them, but on the other extreme, it's frustrating when people blindly follow rules paying no attention to the spirit of the rule. Jesus addressed this with the Pharisees in Mark 2: 27 when he said, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath." The Pharisees were so caught up with following Sabbath rules that keeping Sabbath became a chore, even though the whole purpose of the rules was to help them rest! They focused on the letter of the law, rather than the spirit of the law. May we be people who are wise and adaptable enough to do the right thing with or without a rule that tells us to. May we be transformed people who follow the spirit of who God wants us to be, rather than rule followers who blindly tick boxes.


