

The State of Christian Education Part 2 – by Brady Horner

For those of us who grew up before the 2000's, the local church was typically the main source for our Christian education and knowledge. Theoretically, the preacher and other ministers of the congregation were the (semi) authority on the Bible; our learning would come from them, and our questions would go to them. Now mass Christian culture, media, and the internet have changed all this. The voice of the local church has become just one small portion of our Christian education. This is not a bad thing, but it may require some adapting on the local church's part.

It is humbling for me to know that everyone at Westgate has access to thousands of preachers online that have great charisma and valuable messages to share. People have easy access to influential authors and devotional books that shape theology and faith. Tons of Westgate people have been shaped by Christian "influencers", bloggers, and podcasts. Often in class when someone mentions some obscure Bible fact I'll ask, "How do you know that?" and the answer is almost always, "A podcast." People can do their own study and education online now. They can find information on any topic of their interest and choosing. This has made me rethink how Christian education should be approached at the local church when many are finding their education elsewhere.

It is hard to teach a class to a group of people that a significant portion has received all kinds of Christian education elsewhere, and another portion that still fits the traditional mold of mainly receiving from the local church and personal Bible study. This makes a wide range of needs to meet. It makes the sermon more important as it is the one source of Christian education we are all receiving and mulling together as a congregation. I don't have the answers for all of this, but perhaps the local church should have space for people to share, unpack, question, and debate some of the things they have been learning online, from personal study, and from friends of different Christian traditions. I am working on compiling a list of podcasts, blogs, and other Christian sources people at Westgate are engaging with. 
