Sermon Title: Table Etiquette with Jesus

Scripture: Luke 14: 7-11

When he noticed how the guests picked the places of honor at the table, he told them this parable: "When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take the place of honor, for a person more distinguished than you may have been invited. If so, the host who invited both of you will come and say to you, 'Give this person your seat.' Then, humiliated, you will have to take the least important place. But when you are invited, take the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he will say to you, 'Friend, move up to a better place.' Then you will be honored in the presence of all the other guests. For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

Making Thanksgiving Holy

The theme of this month's messages is *Feast*. We worship a God who invites us to feast. He wants us to enjoy table fellowship and consume what he has to offer. With Thanksgiving just around the corner, we want to share a few ways to make this meal and season more holy.

-Pray at the end of the meal. This will give the prayer more time and thought. Ideally important things to pray about will come to light during the meal's conversation.



- -Share. Have everyone share what they are most grateful for this year, a high point of the year, or how God has blessed them recently. This will also enrich the prayer at the end of the meal.
- -Help. Often just a few people slave away for hours preparing the meal. Some of us don't even know what work went into it. We show reverence for our meal and those who prepared it by seeing and appreciating the real effort that went into it. If you just aren't wanted in the kitchen...do the dishes and cleanup. This is an important and humbling act of service.
- -Slow down. We spend hours preparing the meal then 20 minutes eating. Eat in courses and give time to fellowship and enjoy the hard work of those who prepared.
- -Serve. The best way to be grateful is not to say thanks, but to show it. Find a way to bless someone else on Thanksgiving Day; provide a meal for someone else, send encouraging notes, help with Mission Thanksgiving, or do a random act of kindness.
- -Read Scripture. You don't have to have a Bible Study but reading scripture with extended family can be powerful (and it's rare that we do it). Try opening the meal up with a reading of Psalm 100 or another encouraging Scripture of thanksgiving.
