
Cajun Cones Wednesday

Sermon Title: Nehemiah's Bailout Scripture: Nehemiah 5: 1-6

The Southern Baptist Scandal – by Brady Horner

The Southern Baptists have a scandal on their hands. A recent report has alleged that they have been sweeping cases of sexual abuse under the rug to avoid liability. Apparently, they had stashed away a list of over 700 pastors accused of some form of sexual abuse. I don't know the entirety or the details of these allegations, and I don't want to be quick to write them off like people did with Johnny Depp, but I'm sure there are plenty of terrible and real cases. Southern Baptists are the largest Protestant denomination and basically the definition of evangelical Christianity. The title "Southern" dates to the pre-Civil War era; the southern side split from the rest of the Baptists to continue to allow pastors to own slaves. So, you can imagine the media is just loving this tragic and embarrassing news.

Unfortunately, it is a very bad look for conservative evangelical Christianity and will be used against them for a long time (I say "them" because it is debatable whether Churches of Christ are part of the "evangelical" movement). Churches are not the only place where sex abuse occurs or is swept under the rug. Unfortunately, given the familial culture of love and trust in churches, coupled with the power many pastors have, churches are often ripe grounds for sexual predators. Honestly, every situation is different, and choosing to report can be difficult. It's more than just trying to sweep a scandal under the rug. Maybe, people don't trust how the government authorities will handle it, maybe there is concern about protecting a victim from ridicule, or maybe Churches want to handle the matter (1 Corinthians style) in house without having "unbelievers" make decisions. There are plenty of ways to talk yourself, church, or institution out of reporting, but you should just always report suspected sexual abuse. As the minister here, that is what I will do.

This article series has been exploring the distrust of institutions and this latest scandal is a perfect example of why they are distrusted. The move to not address sexual abuse is made to protect the institution over the individual. When an institution serves itself and not those under its care, something has gone wrong. When local churches are making decisions, it should not just be about them. First, they need to consider the individual people under their pastoral care, second, they need to consider the entire body of Christ. What they do could harm the individual or the image of the universal Church. Unfortunately, we are often tempted to do what is good for the institution rather than the individual or the whole. May we as a Church embrace downward mobility and do what is good for people and the Kingdom.


