Similar spectacular views and hikes in the main park would have had shoulder to shoulder crowds, selfie takers everywhere, and people doing photo shoots with yoga poses. Here it was just Briana and I. A partial reason few were there is because Instagram hadn't popularized it yet. Then I realized why that park ranger didn't want anyone else to know. She didn't want this beautiful secluded area to feel like the main park. Spending time in God's created beauty shouldn't make you feel frustrated, stressed, or broke. "The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork." It should leave you filled with gratitude of a mighty God who created all this, but still has time for you. God's beauty moves you to worship.
