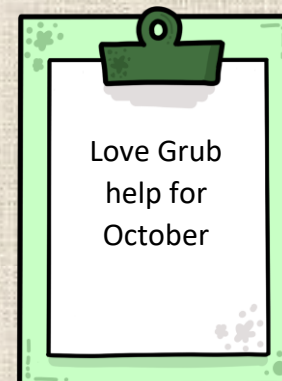
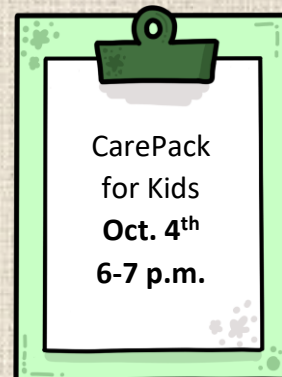
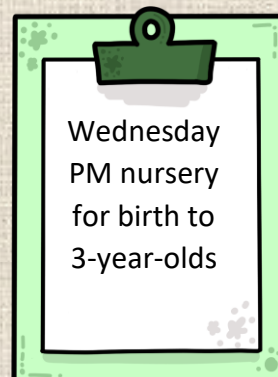

Summer Newsletter from Doug Reeves

On June 7th I was at the airport and the start of my Amazon Adventure. This trip has been almost 3 years in the making. Due to Covid and border closures, we were forced to cancel our plans, not once but twice. Our team from Sunset consisted of myself, Zane Perkins, Ron Fox and Kristin Hagins. We connected in Dallas with a group from Harvest Brazil. Daniel and Carol Morgan, Rod and Linda Nealeigh and Philip Hardin. Our group of nine people carried players in Portuguese, Spanish and Creole, all together we had 540 solar players.



Our first stop was in Manaus, Brazil. Manaus is centrally located at the point the Rio Negro merges with the Rio Solimões to form the Amazon. It is also a major commercial junction between the upper and lower river.



Our first distribution was organized at the Manaus Church of Christ. This is a historic building; it was formerly the home of the lieutenant governor.

One man asked us if he could have 5 players so he might take them up river to various villages and congregations. His journey usually consisted of a three-day journey by boat, spend several days encouraging the

members and then 3 days back. Another man travels 5 days down and then back. It was nice to unpack a few of the players and get them into the hands of church leaders.

Earlier, we met with a local evangelist who works with Haitians. There are over 100,000 Haitian refugees in Manaus and we brought Creole players to assist that outreach. There is also a large group of Venezuelan refugees in Brazil that we hope will benefit from the Spanish players.

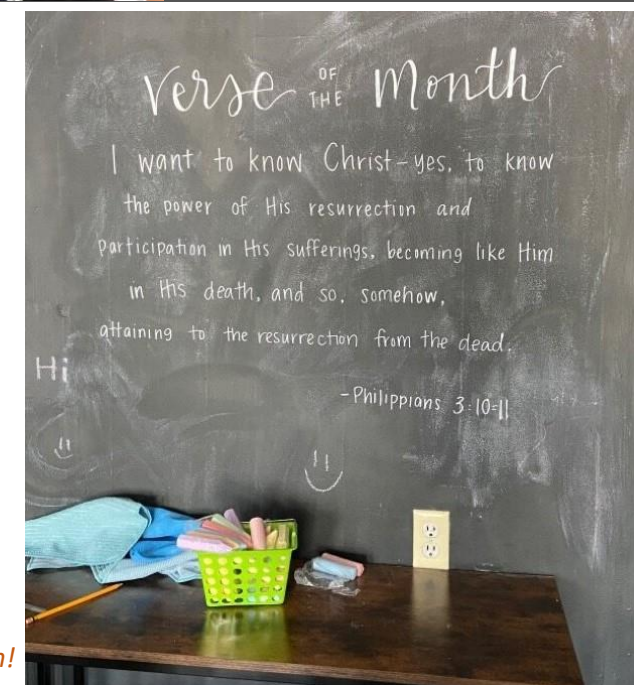
