

The Hoarder in All of Us — by Brady Horner

In 2009 a show called *Hoarders* came out on A&E. It tells the story of different people hoarding and walks through their intervention process. Honestly, I've never seen a single episode, but I have been to the home of a real hoarder. You could barely walk in it, there was nowhere to sit, junk in the yard, in the storage sheds, and even in the car. There is no way this person even knew what all they had or didn't have. It was at this point that I realized the difference between people we casually call hoarders (who just have lots of junk) and people who have a real disorder that requires intervention. As I looked around the house I wondered, how do you let something like this happen? I realized that some of the deeper issues of hoarding are issues in all of us.

One cause of hoarding is a desire to feel safe and secure. A hoarder feels like these items will provide them with security or can be exchanged for money down the road. These items protect them in some way. We all have a need for security and protection, but this is an example of that need getting out of control (likely due to a past trauma). My insecurity over my personal and family safety is manifested in other ways: stress over money, worry, and saving. I have Oct. 17: CarePack for Kids 6 p.m. | a similar issue, but the symptoms are manifested differently.


> Are there any ways that you struggle with security and protection? Are you worried about finances and your future? Or are you more worried about personal physical safety? In what ways are your security concerns manifested? Are you overly controlling? Overly protective? A worrier? It's so much easier said than done, but the Bible repeatedly tells us to trust in God, don't be afraid, and don't worry. Part of coping with this is being able to release the worry (hoarders have a hard time releasing) and trust in God. Perhaps we can all take the baby step of admitting one security fear that is irrational and very unlikely to happen (maybe it's accidental death or a major money loss), then pray to place that in God's hands. Then we can slowly move to bigger things. I believe we will all be much happier and feel much freer when we can learn to entrust God with our protection rather than ourselves.


