Zanmi mwen, we come across some difficult financial challenges that could make someone question how we are able to survive as a ministry. Administratively speaking our decisions often doesn't make sense on how we are going to make it. All we can say is that our God is an awesome God. He continues to amaze us every day. This end of the year is different because we had to forcefully vacate our home due to gangs taking over our community and even ransack our compound and take away everything they wanted. Yet, we keep faith.

Christian Family Center serves the marginalized in its community. Despite of all the ongoing political unrest and gangs' conflict we have done some good work this year. We fed more than 2700 people through our feeding program.



In our monthly reports we continue to express the level of pains and struggles that Haitians are constantly facing daily. A great majority of the people do face starvation. Nine out of ten people who come to our office are seeking some support, mostly something to eat. It is painful to see an adult crying out of desperation for not being able to feed his family, which has been the case on many occasions. Mèsi anpil, as our donors, you didn't have to help but you still do. Because of your generosity CFC can serve some of the most vulnerable in Haiti.
