Sermon Title: Cleansing the Temple

Scripture: John 2: 13-22

When it was almost time for the Jewish Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple courts he found people selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at tables exchanging money. So he made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple courts, both sheep and cattle; he scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. To those who sold doves he said, "Get these out of here! Stop turning my Father's house into a market!" His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for your house will consume me."

The Jews then responded to him, "What sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?" Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."

They replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?" But the temple he had spoken of was his body. After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken.

Holy Places—by Clay Howell

Last Sunday evening, we had a youth group devotional at the Jacob's Dream statue on ACU's campus. As part of this experience, I read the Bible story in Genesis 28 after which this art piece is modeled, and a few details at the start of the story caught my interest.

The passage states that Jacob was traveling from Beersheba to Harran, and that he stops for the night in "a certain place" only because the sun had set. We are told where he came from and where he is going, but not where he currently is. Of course, Jacob goes on to experience a wonderful glimpse of heaven and a promise from God that his descendants (the Israelites) would inherit that land. While the rest of the passage contains a fascinating narrative with powerful imagery, I am struck that God transformed an unnamed, obscure location to a holy place. Throughout the Bible, we read about certain holy places where God's presence is felt strongly-Mount Horeb, the city of Jerusalem, Moses at the burning bush. Perhaps most importantly to the people of Israel, the temple of God and the Holy of Holies within its walls were the most holy places one could imagine. The very presence of God on earth dwelled within that room.

As Christians, we believe that Jesus Christ can make all places and all people holy. Jesus tore the veil in the temple that represented the separation between God and His people. I love that our church tradition is careful not to treat any one place as holier than another. We say "auditorium" rather than "sanctuary." We are quick to rightly point out that the church is the collection of people rather than building. However, we should be careful that we have not watered down the holiness of God. We may begin to believe that there is no such thing as a Holy Place. Instead, we should believe that all places are holy because all of God's creation is holy.

In the Genesis 28 passage, Jacob awakes from his dream and gives his obscure location a name: Bethel, meaning 'House of God.' Let us remember that God's dwelling place can be found wherever He is present; whether it be the church building or the mission field, or even the grocery store or in your car ride home with your family. Praise God for these holy places and holy moments.
