Sermon Title: Communion

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 11: 23-29

For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup. For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves.

Church Criticism: Criticism from Outsiders by Brady Horner

When I was a young youth minister with new ideas one of the hardest things to hear in an elders meeting was, "What if a visitor comes and sees?" I felt this was a way to shut down anything new or different because it might give a hypothetical visitor the wrong idea. I thought they were just "fearing man" (maybe they were), but in 1 Corinthians 14: 23 Paul shares the same concern about speaking in tongues: "If, therefore, the entire church comes together and all speak in tongues, and outsiders or unbelievers enter, will they not say that you are out of your mind?" Paul cared about the reputation of the Church. In his elder's qualification list in 1 Timothy 3: 7 he says an elder should have a good reputation amongst outsiders. He didn't want elders to make the Church look bad, and he wanted them to be approachable. So, maybe those elders were wiser than I thought. We should care what unbelievers think of the Church.

We should at least listen to criticisms of the Church from outsiders. First because Christ died for them and wants to use his Church in redeeming them...so this requires engagement and listening. Second, some of their criticism is based on misunderstandings (In 1 Corinthians 14 Paul was not worried the Church was doing anything wrong, but that they would be misunderstood). We should know those misunderstandings, so, when possible, the Church could adjust to clear those misunderstandings up. A good reputation makes us more approachable, which can help us "win as many as possible". Third, they might have something we need to hear. Often individuals and organizations get tunnel vision and either can't see or refuse to see their flaws. So, they need an outsider who can see things from a different angle to point them out.

This is not to say that we should do everything outsiders say, or bend to every whim of culture. Some criticisms of the Church from outsiders are just flat wrong. 1 Peter 2: 12 says "Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us." It takes courage, wisdom, grace, and humility to engage the world we have been sent to, to listen and learn when needed, but to also let darts of aggression meant to tear down fall to the wayside.
